Lewis Cass Society was awarded first place society in the country at the 2019 National Convention! The congratulation email sent to the society after the event listed the following criterion for the selection based on our Gold level merit entry. The following addresses almost each section of the merit categories. Section A -Average percentage of member participation at each business meeting (Lewis Cass had at least 20%); Section B - Percentage of member retention & percentage of membership increase (Lewis Cass had 100% retention and 100% increase) we started the year with 15 members and ended with 32.

We gained 15 by application and 2 by transfer and no one aged out; Section C -Percentage of magazine subscriptions (Lewis Cass had 100%) all families receive the magazine; Section D - Percentage of Life members (Lewis Cass has 50%). Then the following was used in consideration for the selection -- Section F - Lewis Cass advertises C.A.R. everywhere they go through clothing, social media posts, print coverage and television coverage; Section G – Lewis Cass went over and above the minimum for contest entries, showing they truly promoted the objectives of the National Program. Our society entered 11 officers' contests, and 11 committee contests. Our families are thrilled and are planning a "GOLD" celebration in August, look for the flier in this issue of the Wolverine!!!

2019 Revolutionary War Memorial Grave Blessing

This year, Lewis Cass Society C.A.R. members Layla Frank and Landon Cross assisted with Genesee Chapter's special D.A.R. grave side prayer blessing for Revolutionary War Patriot Cyprian Parrish. He is buried in Greenwood Cemetery, Vernon, Michigan. Cyprian joined the war in 1779 at the age of 13 as a Private in Dutchess Co. New York Militia and also served the 24th Regiment New York Continental Line. He moved from Ohio to Michigan in 1844 and then died May 5, 1852. These D.A.R. "Memorial Prayer Blessings" ceremonies honor patriots that sacrificed personal wealth and some their very lives during the American Revolutionary War.

Genesee's Chaplain Margie Neal visits her Chapter's 13 Revolutionary War Patriots graves every year, of which, Cyprian Parrish is one. Genesee's member Marcy Cross (Layla's Mom, Margie's Daughter) participated in the ceremony this year. This was the first time that the three generations have worked together on a "Memorial Prayer Blessing" ceremony.

A short "Memorial Prayer Blessing" by Chaplain Neal was said at Cyprian's graveside. C.A.R. members Landon placed the American flag and cousin Layla put a small token of remembrance next to the grave. This year it was a small heart green soapstone with the words, "courage" engraved on it. A year to remember.

Michigan SAR Junior Member Program for Male M.S.C.A.R. Members

The Board of Managers of the Michigan SAR recently approved a new program for SAR Junior Members. One portion of the program is to encourage current male members of the M.S.C.A.R. to also join the Michigan SAR as a Junior Member. The only qualifications are that you be male, under the age of 18, and a current member in good standing of the M.S.C.A.R. – meaning that your dues are paid for the current year.

There are several advantages of joining the SAR as a Junior Member while still continuing to be a member of M.S.C.A.R. First of all, it costs you (and your parents) nothing to join or be a member until you reach the age of 18! Second, you will have access to all of the information and activities of SAR – on the national, state, and local chapter levels. You will be assigned to the local chapter nearest to you (unless you have a different preference), and you will be able to get involved with the local chapter and the state society whenever you wish. We even have one current Junior Member in the Michigan SAR Color Guard!

The process for becoming a Michigan SAR Junior Member is quite simple. You need to fill out an SAR application with the same information that is on your C.A.R. application. A Michigan SAR member can help you with that. Then you need to sign it (or a parent/guardian may sign for younger members), make copies of your C.A.R. application and your C.A.R. Certificate Attesting Membership, and present it to a Michigan SAR member for him to sponsor you. That's it! There are no fees or dues required to join the Michigan SAR since you are already a M.S.C.A.R. member, and there will be no annual dues to pay until you are 18.
