As State President of Michigan Society Children of the American Revolution, I have been given the pleasure to attend multiple CAR, DAR, and SAR meetings. Along this journey, I was expanding my knowledge by researching and visiting homeless veteran homes/ facilities across Michigan. Through this, I have met amazing people and shook hands with veterans from around the world. It was an absolute pleasure to meet new people and to work with new and old members of CAR, SAR, and DAR in our efforts in helping homeless veterans. In October, I was given the opportunity to engage with members across DAR and CAR in making tie blankets that were donated from the Heritage Society. Not only was this experience with the Heritage Society an amazing opportunity to deepen connections between CAR and DAR, but it was also a fantastic way for helping our members engage with making donations that would aid homeless veterans.

In October, I was given the privilege of attending a meeting with DAR at the Governor's Mansion Museum in Marshall Michigan. I was given the honor to speak in front of the group about M.S.C.A.R. and about our efforts in helping our heroes. During the experience, my mind was filled with exiting and interesting facts about the Mansion. Not only that, but the keeper of the Mansion generously gave me a personal tour guide of the home and showed me where all the secret doors were and the history behind the Mansions amazing architecture. This was especially exiting for when our CAR members arrived shortly after the DAR meeting ended. Through the CAR/DAR joint meeting, we were given a scavenger hunt to look for items and learn about the history of the Mansion. Here, I was given donations towards my state project. What was fascinating about the experience were the amazing stories the Mansion held within each of its nails. In fact, the keepers of the Mansion made pins out of the old nails that have fallen from the Mansion and has given one to me to continue to spread the knowledge of our Nation's history.

In November, I attended another SAR meeting where I met with one of the Presidents of Sons of the American Revolution to spread the news about M.S.C.A.R and what we are doing. At the meeting, we met at the Plymouth Library where I engaged myself with the information the library had to offer. Through this, I was given the pleasure to speak in front of the SAR board and its members about the new information and stories I have learned on my travels. The members within the SAR chapter graciously gave multiple donations towards my state project. Just a couple days after, I have found the Grand Rapids Home for Homeless Veterans and found out that its residents were in need of cloths and winter attire. With this opportunity, I called the facility and scheduled a meeting with its donation house to drop off the tie blankets donated by the Heritage Society and other supplies I have gathered within CAR/DAR. When I arrived at the donation house, the facility was absolutely gorgeous with gardens, memorials, housing, and an honorary cemetery for veterans. Once I met with the man in charge of the donations, I was told about the facility and learned the story about the homeless veteran home and how their donations reach their residents. I was given a tour of the donation center where I came face-to-face with how much our work through M.S.C.A.R has been impacting the lives of veterans across the nation.

Two days after, I had an exciting full weekend of travel as I have made my way to learning more about my community and our efforts in helping our heroes. I attended a joint meeting for DAR and CAR in Milford Michigan. Here, I was given the pleasure to give a speech about my state project and how wonderful the work our members in M.S.C.A.R. has accomplished in helping our heroes. Not only did I meet many new faces, but I was also given multiple donations in aiding our efforts in helping homeless veterans. The day after, on Veterans Day, the Ki-Ka-Ma-sung society and I ran a Luminarium in honor for veterans and their families. I was given the privilege to lay down a wreath along with the major of Kalamazoo and other members at the memorial in Bronson Park.

In December, I was given the pleasure to have attended Wreaths Across America. The Ki-Ka-Ma-Sung Society (including myself) went to the Fort Custer National Cemetery and laid down multiple wreaths. Here we witnessed the gun salute in remembrance for veterans and gave a moment of silence for the veterans who have fallen. Throughout these couple months, I have learned so much about our nation and the veterans who have protected it. I have met many people and have been given the pleasure to shake hands with authors and members across SAR, DAR, and CAR. These experiences were ones that I will never forget and I have seen the lives of multiple veterans change. It has been a blessing to see how much our members in CAR and members in DAR/SAR have been helping homeless veterans across Michigan and how much of an impact our efforts have been on helping those who have sacrificed for our country.

FORT DEARBORN SOCIETY

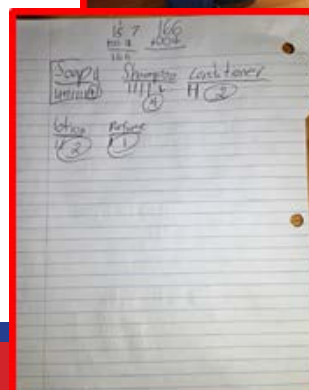
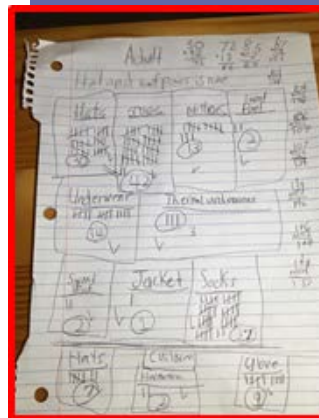

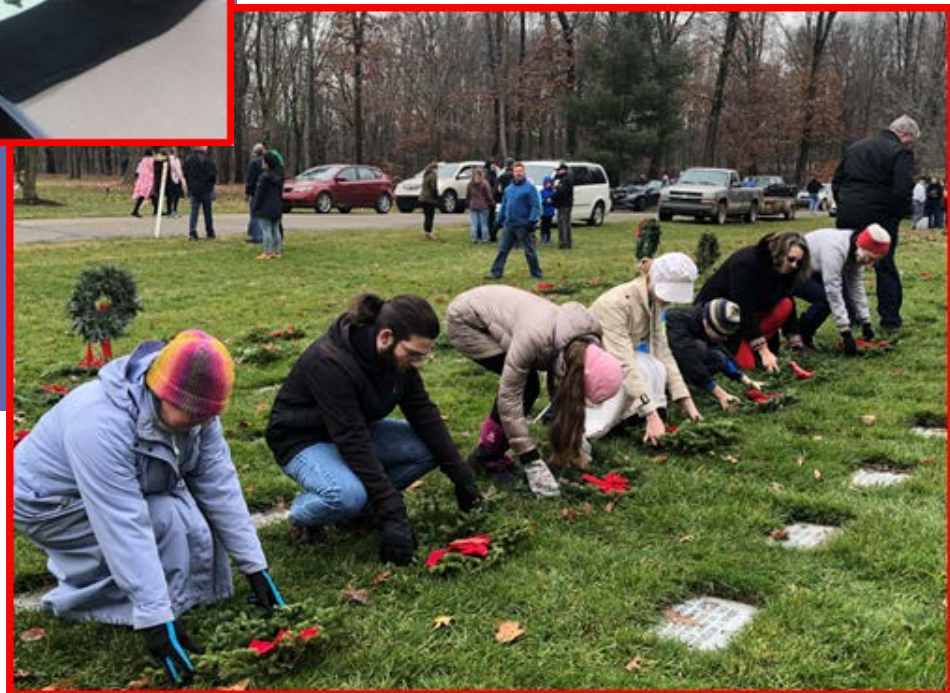

What is the N.S.C.A.R. Endowment Fund?

When you send in your Local Society Donations form, please consider including a donation to the National Endowment Fund.

An endowment fund is a fund that leaves the principal (the money in the account) to be invested, and only spends the additional money that results from the investment. Money that is donated to endowment funds adds to the principal, thus providing additional investment income for years to come.

The Senior National Board of Management established the National Endowment Fund of the Children of the American Revolution in 1958. The income of the National Endowment Fund may be used for the general needs and promotion of the work of the N.S.C.A.R. Individuals or societies make donations to the National Endowment Fund by cash, stocks, or bequests in wills. All principal of the fund is held in perpetuity and invested. The Endowment Fund Advisory Committee is responsible for proper management of investments of the fund.



The Endowment Fund Pin is a circular, open-centered, gold pin with thirteen stars. It is given to anyone who contributes \$100 to the National Endowment Fund or in whose honor \$100 has been given. Therefore, any member of C.A.R., DAR, SAR, S.R., or friend may wear an Endowment Fund Pin.

This pin signifies one who has helped to assure the perpetuation of the ideals of the N.S.C.A.R. The pin is not an official insignia. Ladies may wear the pin as one would wear any piece of fine jewelry; pins of the smaller size may be worn as earrings. The gentlemen's pin is smaller in size and is to be worn on the lapel or as a tie tack.

In honor of the 50th anniversary of the National Endowment Fund, the National Society designed and produced a limited-edition Golden Anniversary Endowment Fund Pin that was received for a donation of \$150 only during the two-year Endowment Fund Golden Anniversary Celebration. This pin was extremely popular. 401 were presented during the celebration from April 19, 2007 through April 25, 2009. This pin is no longer available, but you might still see someone wearing it.
